The European Green Deal

♦ Fit for 55

The Commission is currently preparing its impact-assessed plan for an increased climate target of at least 50% towards 55% in a responsible way for 2030.

Circular Economy Action Plan

Eco-design & sustainable products: Circular electronics – including improving the collection, reuse and repair of mobile phones, laptops and other devices





Industrial Policy Update

The update will take into account the impacts of the COVID-19, the global competitive context, and the acceleration of the twin green and digital transitions.

UPCOMING: Communication on better regulation


- More effective stakeholder involvement
